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

Year 11 Examination Series and Alternative Timetable

I wrote to you in April and outlined the Year 11 End of Year arrangements and the purpose of this letter is to share the plan for the final two week period of examinations and share an alternative timetable that will be in place to support students in their remaining exams.

On Friday morning, 10th June, all year 11 students will be sitting their English Language Component 2 GCSE which is 2 hours in duration. Students will be permitted to leave school on completion of this assessment unless they have their GCSE Physical Education examination in the afternoon. Students will be supervised whilst leaving the school premises and an opportunity will be provided for any student in receipt of a school meal to order a packed lunch 'grab bag' as they will not be in school for their break or lunch time. Mrs Irons will be co-ordinating this over the next two days and students will be able to collect their bag as they exit school.

A revision session for the three classes of GCSE Physical Education students will be delivered by PE staff during lesson 3 as follows:

Mrs Jones Class in F31 Mr Campbell's class in F32 Mr O'Leary's class in F38

Students will then access their lunch at 12.15pm and will start their examination at 1pm. The Physical Education paper is 1 hour in duration, and on completion, students will be permitted to leave the school premises early and staff again will support their exit from school.

Attached to this letter are the lessons / revision sessions that students are expected to attend and, in most cases, students are to attend their lesson at the usual time, with their usual teacher, in their usual room for any subjects that still have outstanding exams from 13th June onwards. These lessons are in red on the timetable and all remaining examinations are included in the schedule.

Students will be expected to arrive in full school uniform to their exams in plenty of time to enable a prompt 9.00am start for a morning session, and 1.00pm for an afternoon session. Students will access the school through the main reception and will congregate in the atrium until invited in the examination venue. Unless students have a revision session, students will be expected to leave the premises from the exam venue.

In the case of revision sessions, class teachers will collect their classes from the main reception and escort them back to reception at the end of the hour session. It is therefore extremely important that students arrive on time as indicated on the timetable for each session. Failure to attend on time will mean staff cannot collect and the session cannot be attended.

Please be advised, that where appropriate, students will be permitted to utilise a quiet revision space on the progress centre if they have a number of exam / revision sessions in one day. This will eliminate the need for students to come backwards and forwards to school and Mrs Irons will work closely with students where requests for a quiet revision space are made.

The Leavers Assembly will take place on **Thursday 23**rd **June** after the final exam, Physics paper 2. On this day, all pupils will need to attend in full school uniform, please ensure the usual standards of appearance are adhered to on this day. The assembly will start at 11.15am and will be a celebration of their last 5 years. There will be an opportunity during the hour for students to sign shirts and we request that a spare school shirt id brought into school for this purpose. Students will not be permitted to sign shirts prior to the assembly which should finish at approximately 12.00pm. Students will be required to leave the school premises after this time to ensure that school can continue to run as normal. It is also essential that year 11 continue to represent the school positively within the community when they leave the building after the assembly.

Further information will be shared in relation to GCSE results day, which is on Thursday, 25th August 2022.

If you require any further information regarding any of the above, please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Irons. The arrangements detailed in this letter will be shared with your child.

Finally, I would like to wish your child every success in their GCSE examinations and to thank you again for your support over the past five years.




KNOWSLEY CUP QUARTER-FINAL



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT AGE CAN I APPLY AND HOW?

You can apply from 15 years, 9 months online APPLY

DO I GET PAID IN TRAINING?

Yes, after food and accommodation you will get around £1,000 per month which increases after 26 weeks.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DO I NEED TO JOIN?

It depends which role you want to do, some roles require no qualifications.

DO I NEED AN APPOINTMENT TO COME IN AND

SPEAK TO SOMEONE AT THE ARMY CAREERS CENTRE?

No – we are open Monday – Friday from 0900 – 1700. Find your local Army Careers Centre <u>here</u>.

DO I NEED SPECIFIC TRAINING BEFOREHAND?

No, we give you all the training you need

DO I GET AN APPRENTICESHIP FROM AFC HARROGATE?

You start your apprenticeship journey at AFC Harrogate, but you will complete your apprenticeship as part of your Trade Training in your job role. 95% of soldiers enrol on an apprenticeship programme.

OPTIONS FOR POST-16 LEARNERS

As we are approaching the end of another academic year, young people in Year 11 will be considering their next step as they prepare to leave school. There's an array of opportunities for post-16 education in Knowsley and Knowsley's young people have a successful track record of achieving their goals.

For the last academic year (2020/2021), 98.5% of school leavers in Knowsley went into education, employment or training – this is the highest rate in the Liverpool City Region and is higher than the national rate of 95.5%. Of the 1,119 school leavers, 1,033 went on to study Level 2 or 3 qualifications in Colleges, Sixth Forms and other further education establishments.

What is available in for Knowsley school-leavers?

At present, further education in Knowsley is available at:-

- Knowsley Community College offering a range of Level 1 to 3 vocational courses and apprenticeships as well as supported learning for Special Educational Needs and / or Disabilities (SEND) students and GCSEs English, Maths and Science
- All Saints Catholic High School Sixth Form offering a range of Level 3 vocational courses in Business, Health and Social care, Uniformed Public Services and Sport alongside A Level Art, Graphics and Textiles
- Bluebell Park post 16 provision for young people with complex needs including independent living skills alongside creative, sports, horticulture and core curriculum
- Alt Bridge School post-16 provision for young people with Education Health Care Plans (EHCPs) with qualifications in life and living skills, employability and Duke of Edinburgh as well as continuing with English and Maths GCSEs and functional skills
- Flourish Further Education 19 to 25 provision for young people with very high and complex needs providing an individualised sensory curriculum and life skills.

A key priority for the Council is to ensure that young people have the right information and support to help them make the important decision about what to do when they leave school. To help with this, the Council has funded Unifrog for all secondary school students – this is an app which helps school leavers understand their options and make positive choices about their future education, employment, or training. Young people should speak to their school if they want to know how to access the app for free!
