## SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Black blazer with blue trim and school badge
- Black trousers or blue/black tartan skirt
- White shirt
- School tie
- Black V-neck Jumper (optional)
- Plain, black, polishable shoes (no boots/trainers)
- Black socks with trousers or white knee high socks/navy tights with skirt

Students must also attend school with a sensible hair style, which is not extreme or which includes unnatural bright colouring or outrageous hair patterns. Hair bands if worn, must be simple and plain.

Jewellery is not allowed with the exception of a wrist watch.

### **PE KIT**

Students will need a school PE T-Shirt with **Halewood Academy** badge. There is a long sleeved over top which is recommended but not compulsory. Students are required to wear either plain black shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings. Parents do not have to purchase all of the items below. Students are expected to bring appropriate footwear to all PE lessons to enable them to engage fully with learning. Students require a clean pair of trainers suitable for indoor and outdoor lessons.

At times during the year, students will undertake PE outside. If students have studded boots suitable for use on grass or our 3G surface, then these are encouraged for outdoor PE lessons as an alternative to trainers.

Students have the option to wear base layers underneath their PE kit, particularly during cold weather. We request that students choose navy blue or black garments that complement our school uniform.

## ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

We expect you to maintain an attendance record of 97% or higher at school. This will ensure you are in the best position to fulfil your potential. If, however, you are ill or unable to attend, or you will be late to school for any reason, then your parent/carer must telephone the school by 8.15am, pressing 1 for the student absence line. You must provide a note written by your parent/carer explaining why you were absent on the first morning of your return to school. For appointments during the day evidence will be required.

In order that you do not fall behind others in your class, you will be expected to catch up on work you have missed during your absence.

### Student Leadership Team Year 7 - Year 10

Throughout your time at Halewood Academy, you will have the opportunity to develop your leadership skills by joining one of our Student Leadership Team groups.

In Year 7 - Year 10, there are 4 different groups you can join, with opportunities to run your own events, present your ideas to staff and act as ambassadors for other students within the school. Appointment of new members will take place each year in October.

#### Prefects Year 11

Each year, we assemble a team of Prefects in school: Year 11 students who are appointed as role-models because they represent everything we ask for in a Halewood Academy student.

They are hardworking, motivated and keen to ensure everyone enjoys our school as much as they do. If you are unsure of something or need assistance ask anyone with a prefect badge and they will help you. Maybe when you are in Year 11 you could be a prefect!



## DINING ARRANGEMENTS

The school is open in the morning for breakfast from 8.00am to 8.30am.

Our students remain on the school premises during break time and lunch time.

At break time, students are able to purchase a variety of items such as toast, bacon/sausage barms, breakfast wraps and a selection of fruit.

There are a wide range of choices that you can have at lunch time:

- A packed lunch from home
- Sandwiches, wraps and baguettes
- Pasta pots (hot or cold)
- A variety of hot meals with a different offering each day

We operate a cashless system at **Halewood Academy** where students pre-load money onto their accounts through ParentPay or designated machines. Students then use their finger print or unique code to purchase food.



## STRETCH & CHALLENGE

Our results also demonstrate that we know how to stretch and challenge students so that they reach their potential and achieve the best possible outcomes. 2023 saw a significant improvement in the number of students achieving the top grades in both GCSE and vocational qualifications.

Our curriculum is designed to ensure that all students receive challenge which allows them to develop skills of analysis, evaluation and deep thinking, at all points in their school career. Not only does this ensure that students can achieve at the highest level within their GCSEs, it also creates a solid foundation for future studies and employment.
